WHAT IS OUR PROJECT?



A very special place for disabled riders

Our project is inspired by disability awareness and the equality of people affected. We have named our society: **De-Quality**.

A main part of this project is the charity who we are raising money for. This is called the *Diamond Riding Centre* for disabled riders. It is a local charity to our school and it is a place where people with any form of disability, mental or physical, or people with special needs, can ride horses/ ponies and find a hobby that they enjoy.

Benefits:

- Helps riders create bonds with animals
- Helps riders to socialise with other people (instructors and other riders)
- Therapeutic and helps a rider's posture

The reason why we picked this charity is because they are at risk of being shut down due to the council longing to build flats on the land. The riding centre needs money to remain open to the public and care for the horses.

Additionally, we chose this project because some members of our families are affected by disability, particularly Lucy's mum who visits the Diamond Riding Centre.

Working together, we are aiming to sponsor a horse that is cared for at the Diamond Riding Centre called Fudge. We have to raise from 1600 to 1700 pounds to do this. Once we raise enough, there will be a plaque next to the stable resembling us and our school.

WHO'S INVOLVED?

The school's local church ran a Christmas Fair, and we thought it would be a great idea to get the support of the church and run our own stall to start off. With the collaboration of other stalls supporting the Diamond Riding Centre, we visited the centre and donated a cheque of £500.
