Wellington College is a British co-educational boarding and day independent school in the village of Crowthorne, Berkshire. Wellington is a registered charity and currently has about 1,050 pupils aged between 13 and 18.

It was built as a national monument to the first Duke of Wellington (1769–1852), after whom the College is named. Her Majesty Queen Victoria laid the foundation stone in 1856 and inaugurated the School's public opening on 29 January 1859. The college was designed by John Shaw, Jr., who had also previously worked as an architect for Eton College.

The College is situated in Crowthorne about 35 miles to the South West of London and can be reached by road from either the M3 or M4. Crowthorne railway station enjoys direct rail links to Reading and Guildford, and our closest airports are Heathrow (around 30 minutes' drive) and Gatwick (just over an hour).



ACCOMODATION

Wellington College provides a traditional boarding experience for students in split gender houses. The boarding houses provide spacious and comfortable accommodation, and there are a range of rooms devoted to both work and leisure. Student bedrooms are a mix of private and dormitories, and facilities include communal lounges, games rooms and a laundry.

MEALS

Meals and refreshments are provided for students and their teachers/chaperones. Most meals will be eaten in the impressive school dining hall, where a wide variety of nutritious hot food and salads are served. On excursions, students will be provided with a packed lunch.

Onsite there is the Victoria and Albert Café which is available for purchasing additional snacks and food.

We have access to a range of state of the art sports facilities.

Wellington College stands on a 400-acre estate in South-East England, near Reading, Berkshire. The grounds of the college include a golf course and woodland in addition to playing fields. The woodland area of the college is listed as a local nature reserve called Edgbarrow Woods.

Horseshoe Lake Activity Centre (within easy walking distance) offers canoeing, dinghy sailing, kayaking, stand up paddle boarding, dragon boating, raft building, and Open Water Swimming plus many more.
