Every day, thousands, or even millions, of garbage are thrown away into the streets due to the lack of awareness of the people.



## Budget

The capital used for most of our activities was obtained through fundraising. Overall, Rp. 960,000,- were gained. We estimated that Rp. 150,000,- were spent for transportation fees to go to Tuk Village, which is quite far from the school or any of the members' homes. On that note, we have spent approximately Rp. 895,000,- for the entirety of the project.



## Activities

### Project 1: Fundraising

On Feb 6 2019, we held a fundraising booth to earn capital for our project. We sold snacks and drinks on our school's annual Intramural event; all of the profit goes to our budgeting.

### Project 2: Clean Day

This is the main focus of our project. We went to cooperate with the Tuk Villagers to clean areas of the village. This promotes a healthy environment for the people as a small step in making our city a cleaner place to live in. We held Clean Day twice: on February 9th and March 16th. On the first occasion, the organic trashes were compiled and processed into compost. On the second time we held it, not only did we

clean the village, but we planted some seeds, another project which will be elaborated shortly.

#### Project 3: Education

Besides directly cleaning, we also took the more subtle approach to keeping the environment hygienic by raising awareness about healthcare to the children of the village.

#### Project 4: Planting

In addition to our healthcare acts, the team made the decision to plant a few seeds in the local field of the village to put the compost into good use, so as to show them the benefits of keeping the environment clean (making fertilizers to be used for farming later) and also to provide them with an additional food source.


### **The Impact of Our Project**

Overall, we believe that our project has been a great success; an estimated total of 7400 people were positively affected through the activities we have done in the past few months. Not only were the villagers delighted, having their home and surrounding areas cleaned, our group members agree that we have all gained something from this experience, such as improving public speaking skills, experience in starting a project, etc. Furthermore, of the 7400 people who benefited, approximately 50 of them were directly involved in helping the team achieving our goals. This demonstrates that we were able to accomplish our aims which are brings benefits to a significant quantity of people with just a small number of workforce.

In addition to the positive impact that we have delivered, we have also calculated the budget it took to bring it to fruition, which equates to roughly US\$62.89, indicating that we were able to achieve much by efficiently making use of the

resources we had, despite not having much.
