## **ACTION POINTS**

Support the team by helping them complete registration and advise them on merits of project idea

Encourage the team(s) to meet on a weekly basis and assign team roles

Encourage the team(s) to collect photos, videos, testimonials etc. to document their journey as well as incorporating methods to measure impact such as surveys, testimonials, data etc.

Discuss the teams Project Update Report and confirm your approval before they submit using the online form

If teams wish to obtain project feedback from the GSL team, ensure they provide as much detail as possible in the Project Update Report

The requirements for the final project submission that will be judged by our panel of external judges are to submit a) 2-page written report and b) a 3 min digital submission (teams must NOT exceed the 3 min limit)

The written report should set out the knowledge gained, individual learning and impact of the project. We strongly encourage making the report visually appealing with images and graphics

Similarly, we encourage teams to be as creative as possible when compiling the digital submission - this can be a YouTube video or Prezi presentation or similar. Clear visuals and high audio quality are important
